My Very Own Book Project (MVOBP)

In 1998, CFUW-Calgary undertook My Very Own Book Project to provide less fortunate children with books they can own. From 2001 - 2010, our club presented the Calgary Urban Project Society's (CUPS) One World Child Development Centre with over 800 books and other learning materials.

CFUW Calgary has also donated \$500 to fund 25 children's individual book bags through the Welcome to Kindergarten Program.

In 2011, Calgary Reads became the continuing recipient of MVOBP donations. As of 2021, CFUW Calgary raised approximately \$15,000 for Calgary Reads.

Beginning in 2022, the club's support of early literacy initiatives in Calgary became CanLearn through support with financial donations and with volunteer work at the Little Red Reading House. CanLearn's manager, Nada Jerkovic, Manager of Literacy Programs at CanLearn, will continue writing her excellent, interesting, and informative columns on early literacy for our newsletter.
